Payment Arrangements

- \$1,000 down payment is required at registration with the expectation to pay the remaining balance by the end of the semester
- Payments may be accomplished through use of Federal Student Aid (Pell Grants and Student Loans), scholarships, our 4-Payment Plan, or any combination of these
- The 4-Payment Plan will allow students to finance up to \$4,000 of their student bill with the college by making four equal payments (Sept. 1, Oct. 1, Nov. 1, and Dec. 1 for the fall semester and Feb. 1, Mar. 1, Apr. 1, and May 1 for the spring semester)
- A 5% discount off of tuition is given if the bill is paid in full at registration by cash, grants, student loans and/or scholarships
- The college business office staff will be glad to discuss your particular circumstances and how to arrange for making college affordable for you

Federal Student Aid

In order to receive Federal Student Aid such as a Pell Grant or a Direct Stafford Loan, you must:

- 1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.gov and list Southeastern Free Will Baptist College as one of your college choice considerations using school code: 042740.
- 2. Contact the college Director of Federal Student Aid at (919) 365-7711 to express an interest in receiving federal student aid.

Federal Student Aid Facts:

- Maximum Pell Grant for 2024-2025 = \$7.395
- Recent trends show that more than one-third of our students receive a Pell Grant
- Maximum and Minimum Pell Grant eligibility are determined based on tax filing requirements, family size and composition (i.e., single parent or non-single parent), Federal poverty guidelines, and state of residence. A general idea of the award can be seen in the chart below but is not guaranteed due to other factors.
- Other factors that may affect the Pell Grant amount include any income allowances or offsets, other education credits, self-employment, and assets of the parent(s) and/or student.
- Direct Stafford Loans allow payments to be delayed until 6 months after graduation or dropping below "half-time" status as a college student and may be given as Subsidized Loans (no interest while in college) or as Unsubsidized Loans
 - (interest accrues while in college).
- Direct Stafford Loan Maximums for Dependent Undergraduate:
 - Year 1: Subsidized = \$3,500 Unsubsidized = \$5,500
 - \circ Year 2: Subsidized = \$4,500 Unsubsidized = \$6,500
 - Year 3+: Subsidized = \$5,500 Unsubsidized = \$7.500

If the family's AGI falls between the two numbers, the Pell Grant is awarded by subtracting the SAI number from the max Pell award (e.g. \$7,395 - SAI of \$1,281 = Pell Award of \$6,114).
